# Logical Beginnings

To the chagrin of many a student who has opened the first pages of Aquinas' magnum opus, *The Summa Theologica*, that student has found the intimidating words of Aquinas that the work was for "beginners in theology." Anyone who has wrestled with the *Summa* knows it is high minded philosophy and theology, much less something that appears to be for "beginners." The key term Aquinas uses, however, is "theology." He says that the *Summa* is for beginners in theology.

In Aquinas' day, prior to studying theology, students would have a firm grasp of the following sciences and they would study them in the following order – logic, mathematics, natural philosophy or physics, ethics, and finally metaphysics. Metaphysics, or "natural theology," was the last discipline to be studied and it required all the aforesaid sciences as a foundation to studying theology.

The scholastics wisely began with logic, for logic studies the relations of conceptual knowledge. It is the study of reason itself and how we reason. The scholastics started there because it was the foundation for recognizing a good argument or a bad one. If one does not know how we think, one will have a difficult time in recognizing incorrect thinking.

While I realize that logic may not be the most enticing of subjects, if we are going to lay a foundation, we must begin here. I promise we will discuss less technical and more entertaining topics in future newsletters. Most students who have studied logic immediately think of the new propositional logic and high minded "equations" of logic. This is not the logic we will be discussing. We are discussing a more fundamental kind of logic, one that gets down to the level of the meaning of terms and not just the relations of ideas. In short, we are looking at Aristotelian logic.

For Aristotle, all thought can be reduced to a syllogistic form. A syllogism is a formal structure that includes at least two premises and a conclusion. In a true syllogism the conclusion necessarily follows the premises. A premise contains a subject and a predicate. The subject is the underlying term that has something said of it. As an example of a syllogism:

Premise 1: All men are mortal

Premise 2: Socrates is a man

Conclusion: Therefore, Socrates is mortal.

In the first premise, the term "men" is the subject, and the predicate is "are mortal." In the second premise, Socrates is the subject and "is a man" is the predicate. The concept man/men is the middle term that connects the two premises. Thus, the conclusion necessarily follows the premises.

All demonstrative syllogisms have a universal premise ("all men," premise 1) and a particular premise ("Socrates," premise 2). The universal premise is considered the "principle" of the argument or the "starting point." Each science has a "principle" or starting point that is the most universal and assumed as part of the science. In geometry that principle is the point (several points make a line, lines make figures); in mathematics the principle is the unit (units being the foundation of algebra), and so forth. Every science assumes a principle it does not prove. So, for instance, a geometrician does not prove the existence of the point, but assumes it as part of the figure he defines.

There are certain final stopping points for all sciences and these are called the indemonstrable first principles. The most notable one that Aquinas relates is known as the principle of non-contradiction, which states, "Affirmation and negation cannot be simultaneously true." Another is the principle of identity, which is that "everything is only itself and nothing else." Keep these principles in mind because as we start to discuss modern ethical relativistic thinking, these will crop up and show us the absurdity in some areas of modern thought. To be continued...
